

HAWKESBURY HERITAGE PUBS

Many of our local establishments have histories dating back well over 200 years.

If the walls could talk, they would speak of stories of the people who constructed them, of tragic accidents, of local icons and of resident spirits that wander the cellars. The buildings themselves are important pieces of history, representing architectural styles of their day.

Take a trip back in time and discover our historical drinking houses. Stay a while, have a drink, a meal and bask in the history that surrounds you.

MACQUARIE ARMS HOTEL

Constructed in 1815 this heritage listed building was built by Richard Fitzgerald in Thompson Square on orders from Governor Lachlan Macquarie. It is Australia's oldest pub on the mainland.

TATES HOTEL

Built on the site in 1840. Original building was demolished in 1938 by Bert Tate and reopened as Windsor Hotel. From 1953 locally referred to as Tate's.

ROYAL RICHMOND HOTEL

Built in 1864 and licenced since 1865. One of the oldest continuously operating pubs in the country. Remained in the ownership of the Walsh Family from 1920 to 1974.

R G MCGEES

Built in 1891 by George Cobcroft. Formerly The Commercial Hotel.



BIRD IN HAND INN

Established 1825. Formally known as 'the Maid of Australia Inn.' An important example of a Georgian Colonial Inn.

SETTLERS ARMS INN

Constructed of locally quarried dressed sandstone by John Sullivan. First licenced in 1836.

THE AUSTRALIAN HOTEL

Established in 1891 was Australia's longest family-owned hotel, it was recently sold and relaunched in 2023. It is situated 56 kilometres from Sydney's CBD.

THE NORTH RICHMOND HOTEL

Named in 1940, but origins go back to 1833 when the "Woolpack Inn" was opened, then in 1874 the name changed to the "Travellers' Rest". In 1933 a more modern hotel was built next to the old inn and in 1940 was renamed the "North Richmond Hotel".

WISEMANS FERRY INN

Dates back to 1827, and was built by Solomon Wiseman a British convict who was sent to the colony of NSW in 1806. Wiseman's Ferry is the oldest ferry crossing still in operation in NSW.
